Tournament Scoring Best of the Best Muskies Inc International Muskie Fishing Tournament October 15 & 16, 2011 - Green Bay, WI

- A. Fish must be at least 30" to score giving the angler 4 points. Add one point for each additional inch.
 - 38 and 3/8" will score 12 points.
 - 38 and 1/2" will be rounded up 1 point for a total of 13 points.
 - 29 and 7/8" will score zero points.
- B. When a musky is caught keep the fish in the water preferably in the net until all measuring tools and camera are ready. There will be no fishing until fish is measured, released, and called in / registered. There will be no transportation of fish.
- C. When a fish is caught anglers will take 3 pictures of the fish.
 - Picture 1: Show the entire fish and team ID tag clearly showing length of fish.
 - Picture 2: Show a close-up of the tail measurement and team ID tag.
 - Picture 3: Show one of the anglers holding the fish and team ID tag.

Fish will then be released. Team will immediately call fish into tournament headquarters. The time that the fish is reported over the phone to headquarters is the official time the fish was caught.

- D. If a Muskie dies after being hooked that contestant will be done fishing for the day. After the fish is registered the partner may resume fishing and the contestant may assist but not fish. Thereafter only two lines are allowed in the water for the remainder of the day if trolling. If casting, the person who caught the fish that died may only watch his/her partner cast.
- E. Tie Breakers: (1) largest point total for either day and time registered (2) which team registered the longest fish for tournament, (3) followed by the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, longest fish of this tournament, if still tied a coin toss will decide the winner.
- F. Contestants are required to keep track of the time from netting the fish to the time the fish is released. A stop watch is recommended but not required. Do the best you can.
